Sisterhood of Survivors

SOS was unknowingly set in motion in 2002, when two women met during their chemo treatments, vowing to go to lunch one day when they felt up to it. By the time they felt ready, the two had become a group of six and met at Marie Callendar's in March of 2003. After that first luncheon they decided to get together the next month, and haven't missed a month since. Luncheons are now held on the second Saturday of each month at various locations.

In the spring of 2006, many of the women began to think past the luncheons and casual conversations and thoughtfully considered how we could extend our reach to more newly diagnosed breast cancer patients rather than waiting for them to hear about SOS and attend a luncheon. Realizing the need to formalize the Sisterhood of Survivors organizational status prior to beginning a project of this magnitude, the Fresno Regional Foundation was contacted. As a qualified 501(c)(3) corporation it allows SOS and other valley organizations to operate under their umbrella which provides for tax deductible contributions and opens other doors.

The inception of the Tote program is the heart of SOS. Wanting to reach out to newly diagnosed breast cancer patients, SOS began making Totes filled with educational items and other items we identified we needed during our journey. For example, *Dr. Susan Love's Breast Book* and *Chicken Soup for the Breast Cancer Soul* have both been donated for inclusion in the Totes. Daryle Sakamoto has been extremely gracious each time we prepare to make totes and individual members also contribute to the program by bringing donations to the monthly luncheons.

SOS members (breast cancer survivors) deliver Totes to homes, hospitals and treatment centers allowing the newly diagnosed patient an opportunity to talk with someone whom she can relate to. SOS has delivered over 50 Totes in the last 12 months.

At a recent planning meeting, Judy Pearson of Madera, a survivor of over 20 years, asked if there was something Sisterhood of Survivors needed. It was suggested an online presence would be beneficial in promoting SOS. Thanks to Judy, SOS went online September 1, 2007. As the site is being updated weekly, please check back often. SOS also publishes quarterly newsletters, prepared by Diana Dhuyvetter, member and survivor since 2003.
